## FILE OF LIFE

### ... what if?

Every second counts, especially during life-threatening situations. An ambulance rushes to an address, medical technicians race up the walk toward the home of someone with a medical emergency. When they arrive, the person may be unconscious or confused, and the emergency team may be left with few facts to go on. Does the patient have any preexisting conditions? Is he or she taking any medications? What about allergies?

This frightening scenario is all too common for EMTs (emergency medical technicians) when time is precious and lives are in the balance. But what if you had a medical mini-history posted on your own refrigerator door to help the emergency response team?

The FILE OF LIFE card provides a quick medical history when you or a family member is unable to respond. The card eliminates the risk of the patient, who under stress, may forget to mention something important; or at those times when a patient cannot respond at all. The card, kept on your refrigerator door in a red plastic

pocket labeled FILE OF LIFE, lists your name, emergency medical contacts, health problems, medications, dosages, allergies, recent surgeries, religion, doctor's name, and a health-care proxy.

You fill out the information, put it on your refrigerator door, and it's all kept confidential, until it is needed.

Who benefits? Seniors, allergy sufferers, anyone involved in an accident, diabetics, etc.

And, thanks to the Minerva Park Police and Fire Departments, it's FREE to residents.

To obtain a FILE OF LIFE card, email [firechief@minervapark.org](mailto:firechief@minervapark.org) with the best time to bring a FILE OF LIFE card to your home, or call the non-emergency numbers of either the Fire Department (882-3375) or the Police Department (882-1408, Christy Nordman's mailbox) and leave your name and phone number, a FILE OF LIFE card will be delivered to you.

This is your opportunity to speak when you can't - and it could help save a life during an emergency - perhaps even your own. •

**Thank You:** An office window was broken at the pool this summer. Mike Rosati, owner of Rosati Windows and former Minerva Park resident of many years, provided a replacement window at a discounted price, and resident Tom Shannon installed it for us. Many thanks to both of them.

**Replacement Levy:** As mentioned in last month's issue of the Villager, there will be a 1.9 mill Replacement Levy on the November ballot. Your support is very important. This is not a new levy or a new tax. It is a replacement for a levy that is expiring. According to the Auditor's Office, this levy will generate \$73,630.40. These monies will pay for the continuation of services such as police

protection, EMS & fire services, trash hauling, yard waste and curbside recycling programs, leaf removal, mosquito spraying, snow removal, and maintenance of parklands, etc. Please call (882-5743) or email (mayor@minervapark.org or sctreasmp@msn.com) if you have any questions. **Brownouts:** Is anyone still having trouble with power surges? I need to know the locations and durations if we are still experiencing these incidents so we can report them to AEP.

**Christmas Carriage Rides:** Yes, it's that time again. This year's event will be held Sunday, December 19, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. The reservation deadline is December 1. See page 5 for details and the reservation form.

**2010 Street Project:** As I am writing my report to you, the 2010 Street Project is nearly finished except for some curb replacement and repairs and few other punch list items. There is an issue that bears mentioning. Before the street paving company starts a project, they have to clear the curb and gutter areas so the machinery can navigate and work effectively. In this recent project, we saw more Village rights-of-way obstructed with plants, trees, and bushes that in any other street project we have undertaken. While I for one am happy to see landscaping even down to the curb, property owners need to realize that when walls are erected and bushes, trees, and flowers are planted on public easements, they will always be at

risk of removal for street and utility repair work.

All Council Members were present for the Regular Council meeting held October 11. The following reports were made.

**Police:** Acting Chief Adam Beach reviewed his monthly report. He is looking into Children's ID Kits for Safety Day, and the new vests have arrived for all of the officers. The current vests will be donated to the Fire Department.

**EMS/Fire:** Chief Rick Hoehstetter reviewed his monthly report. The oxygen tank on the EMS vehicle developed a leak and has been repaired. The File of Life (page 1) was explained and is ready for distribution to the residents.

**Planning & Zoning and Code Enforcement:** Code Enforcement Officer Dick Busick reviewed his monthly report. An application for a deck was approved, and business applications were approved: a daycare will be established at 3205 Dublin-Granville Road, Good Dog Grooming will move to 5084 Cleveland Avenue, and a center for ESL, cultural training, etc., will open in the shopping center on Cleveland Avenue at Jordan Road.

## Arborist Tree Talk LEAVES Residents Hopeful for Healthier Trees

Eleven people showed up Saturday, October 16, to hear Chris Ahlum (Ahlum and Arbor Tree Preservation) discuss tree care and concerns. He emphasized that proper pruning techniques and proper planting can do a lot to prevent future problems and high tree service costs.

Several years ago, I stood in my backyard in amazement as I watched "Tree Surgeons" climb straight up my 120' tall silver maple tree to prune dead branches away from service wires. What I did not realize at the time was that the 6" to 8" spikes that the men were using strapped to their boots were actually creating future damage to my tree. Chris showed us pictures of spike damage on trees that were climbed with spikes, which later resulted in a total tree removal because of tree girdling. The bottom line is that proper pruning techniques and hiring competent professionals to handle the task are key to tree health and longevity.

When choosing an arborist to care for your trees, there at least 4 things that you need to keep in mind:

1. Make sure your tree service is certified.

2. Your tree service should belong to professional trade associations. Associations to look for are ASCA, TCIA, and ISA.
3. Insurance - Both you AND your tree service should have insurance. Ask about workers compensation to prevent having to absorb high costs for unfortunate accidents. Be prepared!
4. Make sure your arborist tree service knows what they are talking about. It was suggested to avoid organizations that use terms such as "we top trees." Tree topping is said to be a recipe for future disaster.

One of the topics discussed during this presentation was species selection. When asked about what tree species to choose that do not produce too much trash when re-planting, I was surprised to learn that Mr. Ahlum often suggests hackberry. Other species include beech trees, slippery elm, and fruitless cultivars of ginko and sweetgum. The Village has a list of recommended tree species for our area.

The Green Team is working hard to create opportunities for residents to learn about and care for one of the most outstanding qualities of Minerva Park, our trees. If you are interested in learning more about ways to live sustainably, including tree care, call Greg Wittmann or come to our next Green Team meeting where we will host an AEP representative to talk about home energy conservation.

### Leaf Collection Tips

- Rake leaves to the curb area only – not into the street. Leaves placed in the street become wet and may block storm sewers.
- No foreign materials like brush, twigs, or grass clippings, which may damage the leaf machine.
- Refrain from on-street parking, which significantly inhibits collecting leaves from behind parked vehicles.
- If you live on a cul-de-sac or circle, park in driveways so the leaf machine can make the turns.
